Community:

Comstock Park is a suburb in the metropolitan area of Grand Rapids, Michigan. Encompassing nine square miles, the district consists of one high school (9-12), one middle school (6-8), two elementary schools & and an Early Childhood center. Our alternative program is housed at our high school and is called the CP Flex Academy.

Demographics: Comstock Park High School is a four-year public school enrolling 536 students in grades 9-12; 35 students are enrolled in the Flex Academy program (grades 10-12). The student body is somewhat diverse with 55% white, 30% Hispanic, 10% African-American, 2% American Indian, and 3% Asian.

54% of our students qualify for the Federal Student Free/Reduced Lunch Program.

Our graduation rate for the class of **2024** was 99% .

School Year/School Day: Two Semesters (August - December; January - May for seniors; January - June for underclassmen. Six period day with 50 minute instructional periods and a 45-minute advisory. Students attend all classes, five days per week.

Curriculum and Graduation Requirements: In order to earn a diploma from CPHS, students must fulfill the Michigan Merit Curriculum and earn a total of 23 credits - 18 required & 5 electives. Modifications may be made for students with an IEP and/or a Personal Curriculum. All students must participate in the Michigan Merit Exam, which includes the SAT School Day, three of the ACT WorkKeys subtests and the science & social studies M-Step. A score of a 3 or better on each WorkKeys test is also required to earn a diploma from CPHS and CP Flex Academy. Flex Academy seniors must earn a minimum of the 18 MMC credits for a HS diploma.

We offer the following **Advanced Placement (AP) courses**: Calculus AB, Chemistry, English Language & Composition, English Literature & Composition, Psychology, Statistics, United States Government & Politics, and United States History. AP is an open-enrollment program. We do not offer honors courses.

Qualified students may enroll concurrently in college courses through our dual enrollment program: local institutions we typically partner with include Grand Rapids Community College (GRCC), Kendall College of Art & Design (KCAD), Ferris State University, Grand Valley State University & Aquinas College.

Grading Scale and Grade Point Average: GPA is calculated using the scale below:

Only weighted GPA is tracked and listed on the transcript. All courses recorded on the transcript with a *letter grade* are included in the computation. CR represents that credit was issued; NC denotes no credit was issued; both CR & NC are typically **not** included in the GPA calculation. E/CR means a student was issued credit for the course but given a zero for GPA purposes due to excessive absences exceeding the attendance policy. AP courses are weighted by 1 point. GPA & rank are updated in January and June.
